6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to the Grand River Dam Authority;
8 amending 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, which relates
9 to exemptions from the Open Records Act for the
10 Authority; providing for the exemption of certain
11 records from the Authority for certain purposes; and
12 providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 862.1. In addition to the powers, rights and privileges
17 enumerated in Section 862 of this title, the Grand River Dam
18 Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of the:

19 1. The Oklahoma Open Records Act, exclusively limited to:

20 a. customer proprietary information the Authority is
21 contractually obligated to keep confidential, ~~and~~

22 b. security plans and procedures in its role as an
23 electric utility regulated by the federal government,

24 c. information related to the security of electrical or
dam infrastructure and related information systems

1 that, if misused, could interfere with, attack,
2 compromise, or incapacitate the infrastructure or
3 information systems including information related to
4 the ability of the infrastructure or information
5 systems to resist such interference, compromise, or
6 incapacitation. Such information includes, but is not
7 limited to, any planned or past assessment,
8 projection, or estimate of the vulnerability of
9 critical infrastructure or information system,
10 security testing, risk evaluation, risk management
11 plans, operational plans, structural schematics,
12 recovery or response plans, or risk audits,
13 d. information from its contractors, suppliers, and
14 customers which the Grand River Dam Authority
15 determines are confidential books, records, or trade
16 secrets, and
17 e. proprietary or commercial information received subject
18 to a nondisclosure agreement or confidentiality
19 agreement;

20 2. The Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, exclusively limited to
21 authorizing the Grand River Dam Authority Board of Directors to
22 confer on:

- 23 a. coal or gas fuel supply and transportation contracts,
24 b. power purchase agreements, and

1 c. security plans and procedures in its role as an
2 electric utility regulated by the federal government;
3 and

4 3. Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

5 4. The Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination
6 Act;

7 5. The State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

8 6. The Surplus Property Act; provided that, l the district may,
9 on a transactional basis, elect to make itself subject to the
10 requirements of the Surplus Property Act.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
