6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to water and water rights; defining
8 term; creating a heritage river designation;
9 providing for the Oklahoma Water Resources Board to
10 provide certain designation; establishing protections
11 for heritage rivers against certain uses; prohibiting
12 water sale and transfer from a heritage river;
13 providing the Oklahoma Water Resources Board
14 authority over the provisions and protections of a
15 heritage river; maintaining certain existing
16 practices along heritage rivers; protecting certain
17 property rights for landowners adjacent to a heritage
18 river; providing for codification; and providing an
19 effective date.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 897 of Title 82, unless there is
23 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 A. As used in this section, "heritage river" means any river or
stream that has maintained a free-flowing and undammed status for
all of Oklahoma's statehood.

B. A heritage river, having been free-flowing and undammed
since Oklahoma's statehood, possesses natural elements such as

1 water, fish, wildlife, and outdoor recreational values of present
2 and future benefit to the people of the state. For this purpose,
3 the Glover River in McCurtain County shall be designated a heritage
4 river.

5 C. On or after the effective date of this act, any river
6 designated as a heritage river pursuant to this act shall not be
7 impounded by any large dam or structure for industrial purposes and
8 no entity shall sell or transfer water from any heritage river.

9 D. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall have authority over
10 the provisions of this act and shall promulgate rules. The Oklahoma
11 Water Resources Board shall:

12 1. Prepare, adopt, and publish management plans and other
13 documents to guide public and private activities and programs;

14 2. Consider and comment on public and private practices and
15 proposed actions that may affect a heritage river;

16 3. Recommend standards for local government agencies whose
17 political boundaries include all or part of a heritage river;

18 4. Own and control public access points for a heritage river,
19 and purchase easements and fee title to land along a heritage river
20 for public purposes which are to be held by the Board as an agency
21 of this state; and

22 5. Identify public and private nuisances that adversely affect
23 a heritage river and take lawful action to abate nuisances.

1 E. 1. Nothing in this act shall be construed to unduly
2 restrict or adversely affect the use of property within any heritage
3 river basin for farming, ranching, forestry, silviculture, and other
4 agricultural uses if such uses are not inconsistent with the
5 purposes of this act. Present farming, ranching, forestry,
6 silviculture, and other agricultural uses and practices shall be
7 exempt from the provisions of this act.

8 2. The provisions of this act shall not be construed to affect
9 existing rights between a landowner and a utility or pipeline
10 company.

11 3. The property rights of private landowners adjacent to a
12 heritage river shall be the same as in any other area of the state.
13 The unauthorized use of private property shall be deemed trespassing
14 and subject to the penalties provided for such an offense.

15 4. Nothing in this act shall be construed to restrict public
16 recreational uses of a heritage river.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
