21	with a yield of 688 pounds per harvested acre; and
22	WHEREAS, cotton grown in Oklahoma provides feed for livestock,
23	fiber for clothing, cotton seed oil for cooking, cellulose for
24	plastics and high-quality paper for currencies; and
