12	to enact specific requirements for proof of identity; providing ballot title; and directing filing.
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16	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
17	2ND SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
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19	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
20	the following proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by
21	adding a new Section 6 to Article III to read as follows:
22	Section 6. Each voter shall present proof of identity to the
23	appropriate election official when voting at any election authorized
24	by law and conducted by a county election board. Proof of identity

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1	shall be required for voting in person, by absentee or mail ballot,
2	and by any other method authorized by law. The Legislature shall
3	enact laws as may be necessary to specify the requirements for proof
4	of identity for voting as required by this section.
5	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
6	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
7	the following form:

9	Legislative Referendum No State Question No
10	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
11	This measure adds Section 6 of Article 3 of the Oklahoma
12	Constitution to require proof of identity to vote in any
13	election authorized by law and conducted by a county election
14	board. The measure requires proof of identity for all
15	authorized methods of voting. The measure requires the
16	Legislature to enact laws to specify requirements for proof of
17	identity for voting.
