13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 5000.24, is									
14	amended to read as follows:									
15	Section 5000.24 A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority,									
16	following directives of and upon approval of the Health Care									
17	Financing Administration, is directed to implement a Medicaid Buy-In									
18	Program <del>for persons with disabilities, if funds become available</del> .									
19	Components of such program shall include, but not be limited to:									
20	1. Allowing individuals with disabilities who are sixteen (16)									
21	years of age and over, but under sixty-five (65) years of age, and									
22	who, except for earned income, would be eligible to receive									
23	Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits, regardless of whether									
24	they have ever received Supplemental Security Income (SSI) cash

benefits, the option of purchasing Medicaid coverage that will

enable individuals with disabilities to gain and/or maintain

employment and reduce their dependency on existing cash benefit

programs;

- 2. Removing work disincentives that inhibit individuals with disabilities from engaging in work that is commensurate with their abilities and capabilities Reducing deductibles;
- 3. Developing an infrastructure within and outside state
  government that supports efforts to enhance employment opportunities
  for individuals with disabilities Maximizing services available
  before deductibles; and
- 4. Ensuring meaningful input in the design, implementation, and evaluation of programs, policies, and procedures developed under such program by individuals with disabilities and other interested parties Providing predictable cost sharing;
  - 5. Maximizing subsidies;

- 6. Limiting adverse premium impacts;
- 7. Reducing barriers to maintaining and improving health;
- 8. Encouraging choice based on value; and
- 9. Limiting increases in health premium rates.
- B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board shall promulgate any rules necessary to implement provisions of the Oklahoma Ticket to Work and Work Incentives Improvement Act regarding the Medicaid Buy-In Program.
