L3	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L 4	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3000 of Title 25, unless there
L5	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
L 6	A. As used in this section:
L7	1. "At retail" shall include any retail transaction conducted
L8	in person and shall exclude any telephone, mail or Internet-based

20	2. "Regular business hours" shall mean the regular hours a
21	business is open to the public to conduct business transactions; and
22	3. "Retail establishment" shall mean a place of business open
23	to the general public for the sale of goods or services.

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B. A retail establishment selling or offering for sale goods or services at retail during regular business hours shall not require a buyer to pay using credit nor prohibit cash as payment in order to purchase the goods or services. A retail establishment selling or offering for sale goods or services at retail during regular business hours shall accept cash as legal tender when offered by the buyer as payment.

- C. Any person in violation of subsection B of this section shall be subject to a warning for a first violation. A second violation shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). A third violation shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00). A fourth or subsequent violation shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). The penalties in this subsection shall be enforced by the Office of the Attorney General. Fines collected by the Office of the Attorney General shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund.
 - D. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:
- 1. Any person selling or offering for sale goods or services at an airport, provided that at least two persons selling food at each terminal within the airport accept cash as payment;
- 2. Any parking facility owned by a municipality, regardless of whether the facility is operated by the municipality, a parking authority, or an independent third party; and

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3. Any parking facility that accepts mobile payment, provided
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    that the facility does not accept payment by any means other than

    mobile payment.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
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
