preserve the previous dosage and regimen and to make timely referrals necessary to ensure the patient's continued care.

These referrals may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Mental health medication management;
- 2. Pain medication management; and
- 3. New primary care practitioner.
- C. A practitioner providing prescriptions to ensure the continuity of care to a patient shall be protected from adverse regulatory action or prosecution of crimes involving prescriptions for ninety (90) days from the date of the first visit of the patient when the practitioner is continuing previous doses and regimens for the patient. Previous dosages and regimens for medications included in the central repository database may be proven by accessing the central repository when electronic or physical records are unavailable and documentation is necessary.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
