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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-725.3, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 1-725.3 A. A health care provider shall make available
18	to the public, in a single document, either electronically or by
19	posting conspicuously on the provider's website if one exists, the
20	health care prices for at least the twenty most common health care
21	services the health care provider provides. If the health care
22	provider, in the normal course of his or her practice, regularly
23	provides fewer than twenty health care services, the health care
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provider shall make available the health care prices for the health
 care services the provider most commonly provides.

B. The health care provider shall identify the services by:
A Current Procedural Terminology code or other coding system
commonly used by the health care provider and accepted as a national
standard for billing; and

7 2. A plain English description.

8 C. The health care provider shall update the document as 9 frequently as the health care provider deems appropriate, but at 10 least annually.

11 <u>D. A health care provider not in compliance with the</u> 12 <u>Transparency in Health Care Prices Act shall be assessed a penalty</u> 13 in the following amounts:

14 <u>1. One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month for health care</u>
 15 <u>providers with ten or fewer licensed health care professionals; or</u>
 16 <u>2. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each licensed health care</u>
 17 <u>professional per month for health care providers with more than ten</u>
 18 <u>licensed health care professionals. This penalty shall not exceed</u>
 19 <u>Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per month.</u>

<u>E. Penalties shall be collected by the State Department of</u>
 <u>Health and deposited into the Health Carrier Access Payment</u>
 <u>Revolving Fund pursuant to Section 7202 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma</u>
 <u>Statutes.</u>

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1SECTION 2.AMENDATORY63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-725.4, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 1-725.4 A. A health care facility shall make available 4 to the public, in a single document, either electronically or by 5 posting conspicuously on its website if one exists, the health care 6 prices for at least:

7 1. The twenty most used diagnosis-related group codes or other 8 codes for inpatient health care services per specialty service line 9 used by the health care facility for billing; and

The twenty most used outpatient CPT codes or health care
 services procedure codes per specialty service line used for
 billing.

B. A health care facility shall include with the health care
prices provided pursuant to subsection A of this section a plain
English description of the services for which the health care prices
are provided.

17 C. The health care facility shall update the document as18 frequently as it deems appropriate, but at least annually.

19 <u>D. A health care facility not in compliance with the</u> 20 <u>Transparency in Health Care Prices Act shall be assessed a penalty</u> 21 <u>in the following amounts:</u>

22 <u>1. Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per day for a facility with</u> 23 <u>thirty or fewer beds; or</u>

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1	2. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each bed per day for facilities
2	with more than thirty beds. This penalty shall not exceed Five
3	Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$5,500.00) per day.
4	E. Penalties shall be collected by the State Department of
5	Health and deposited into the Health Carrier Access Payment
6	Revolving Fund pursuant to Section 7202 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma
7	<u>Statutes.</u>
8	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
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
