15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified							
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.527-1 of Title 70, unless							
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:							
19	A. Schools may create teacher-to-student mentorship programs to							
20	provide emotional, academic, and coping assistance to students who							
21	have challenges at home and school.							
22	B. A school district shall develop guidelines and eligibility							
23	criteria for the mentorship program which are specific to the unique							
24	faculty and student population of the school district.

C. The mentorship program shall:

- 1. Require written permission by the parent or legal guardian of the student allowing the teacher to:
 - a. access school records and files of the student, and
 - b. schedule regular meetings with the student;
- 2. Include regularly scheduled meetings and conferences with the parent or legal guardian of the student to provide updates and progress reports on the status of the mentorship; and
- 3. Establish procedures for students who need to meet immediately with their mentor teachers. If the school administrator is unable to schedule a time for the student to meet with the mentor teacher, another teacher may act as a substitute mentor teacher. The substitute mentor teacher shall be compensated on a prorated amount the teacher would be paid for regular instructional time.
- D. Teachers shall not be required to participate in the mentorship program. If a teacher chooses to serve as a mentor, the teacher shall:
- 1. Only be permitted to serve as a mentor to up to three (3) students each school year; and
- 2. Be compensated Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) per mentoring student each school year. This compensation shall be in addition to the annual salary of the teacher in the form of extraduty pay.
