HOUSE BILL 3717

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to vaccine pop-ups; defining term; prohibiting certain vaccine pop-ups; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3411 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. As used in this act:

1. "COVID-19 vaccine" means vaccine intended to provide acquired immunity against severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the virus that causes coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19);

2. "Emergency Use Authorization" means an authorization where the U.S. Food and Drug Administration may allow the use of unapproved medical products, or unapproved uses of approved medical products in an emergency to diagnose, treat, or prevent serious or

1 life-threatening diseases or conditions when certain statutory
2 criteria have been met, including that there are no adequate,
3 approved, and available alternatives; and

4 3. "Vaccine pop-up" means a mobile vaccination clinic in a
5 community-based setting such as a community center, auditorium or a
6 tent that is set up for a short time frame in addition to
7 traditional vaccine locations.

8 B. Vaccine pop-ups shall be prohibited for COVID-19
9 vaccinations being administered under an Emergency Use Authorization
10 from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
