14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3411 of Title 63, unless there

17	1. "COVID-19 vaccine" means vaccine intended to provide
18	acquired immunity against severe acute respiratory syndrome
19	coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the virus that causes coronavirus
20	disease 2019 (COVID-19);
21	2. "Emergency Use Authorization" means an authorization where
22	the U.S. Food and Drug Administration may allow the use of
23	unapproved medical products, or unapproved uses of approved medical
24	products in an emergency to diagnose, treat, or prevent serious or

1 life-threatening diseases or conditions when certain statutory 2 criteria have been met, including that there are no adequate, 3 approved, and available alternatives; and 4 3. "Vaccine pop-up" means a mobile vaccination clinic in a 5 community-based setting such as a community center, auditorium or a 6 tent that is set up for a short time frame in addition to 7 traditional vaccine locations. 8 B. Vaccine pop-ups shall be prohibited for COVID-19 9 vaccinations being administered under an Emergency Use Authorization 10 from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. 11 SECTION 2.
