7	An Act relating to mental health; amending 43A O.S.
8	2021, Section 1-103, which relates to definitions; modifying definitions; and providing an effective date.
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 43A O.S. 2021, Section 1-103, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1-103. When used in this title, unless otherwise
16	expressly stated, or unless the context or subject matter otherwise
17	requires:
18	1. "Department" means the Department of Mental Health and
19	Substance Abuse Services;
20	2. "Chair" means the chair of the Board of Mental Health and
21	Substance Abuse Services;
22	3. "Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thought,
23	mood, perception, psychological orientation or memory that
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significantly impairs judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize
 reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life;

3 4. "Board" means the Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
4 Services as established by the Mental Health Law;

5 5. "Commissioner" means the individual selected and appointed
6 by the Board to serve as Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance
7 Abuse Services;

8 6. "Indigent person" means a person who has not sufficient
9 assets or resources to support the person and to support members of
10 the family of the person lawfully dependent on the person for
11 support;

12 7. "Facility" means any hospital, school, building, house or 13 retreat, authorized by law to have the care, treatment or custody of 14 an individual with mental illness, or drug or alcohol dependency, 15 gambling addiction, eating disorders, an opioid substitution 16 treatment program including, but not limited to, public or private 17 hospitals, community mental health centers, clinics, satellites or 18 facilities; provided, that facility shall not mean a child guidance 19 center operated by the State Department of Health;

8. "Consumer" means a person under care or treatment in a facility pursuant to the Mental Health Law, or in an outpatient status;

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9. "Care and treatment" means medical care and behavioral
 health services, as well as food, clothing and maintenance,
 furnished to a person;

Whenever in this law or in any other law, or in any rule or 5 order made or promulgated pursuant to this law or to any other law, 6 or in the printed forms prepared for the admission of consumers or 7 for statistical reports, the words "insane", "insanity", "lunacy", 8 "mentally sick", "mental disease" or "mental disorder" are used, 9 such terms shall have equal significance to the words "mental 10 illness";

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 (2) poses a substantial risk of immediate physical

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 harm to another person or, persons, or property

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 as manifested by evidence of violent behavior

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 directed toward another person or persons or

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 extreme destruction of property,
 - (3) has placed another person or persons in a reasonable fear of violent behavior directed towards such person or persons or serious physical harm to them as manifested by serious and immediate threats,
 - (4) is in a condition of severe deterioration such that, without immediate intervention, there exists a substantial risk that severe <u>mental</u> impairment or <u>physical</u> injury will result to the person, or
 - (5) poses a substantial risk of immediate serious physical injury to self or death as manifested by evidence that the person is unable to provide for and is not providing for his or her basic physical needs, or
- 21 (6) has a relevant past history of inflicting or 22 <u>attempting to inflict harm to one or more</u> 23 <u>persons, which indicates that there is a</u>

2		conduct will occur again.
3	b.	The To the extent it is reasonably available, the
4		mental health or substance abuse history of the person
5		shall be considered and may be used proffered as part
6		of the evidence to determine whether the person is a
7		person requiring treatment or an assisted outpatient.
8		The mental health or substance abuse history of the
9		person shall not be the sole basis for this
10		determination.
11	с.	Unless a person also meets the criteria established in
12		subparagraph a or b of this paragraph, "person
13		requiring treatment" or an "assisted outpatient" shall
14		not mean:
15		(1) a person whose mental processes have been
16		weakened or impaired by reason of advanced years,
17		dementia, or Alzheimer's disease,
18		(2) a person with intellectual or developmental
19		disability as defined in Title 10 of the Oklahoma
20		Statutes,
21		(3) a person with seizure disorder,
22		(4) a person with a traumatic brain injury, or
23		(5) a person who is homeless.
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d. A person who meets the criteria established in this
section but who is medically unstable, or the facility
holding the person is unable to treat the additional
medical conditions of that person, should be
discharged and transported in accordance with Section
1-110 of this title;

7 14. "Petitioner" means a person who files a petition alleging 8 that an individual is a person requiring treatment or an assisted 9 outpatient;

10 15. "Executive director" means the person in charge of a 11 facility as defined in this section;

12 16. "Private hospital or facility" means any general hospital 13 maintaining a neuro-psychiatric unit or ward, or any private 14 hospital or facility for care and treatment of a person having a 15 mental illness, which is not supported by the state or federal 16 government. The term "private hospital" or "facility" shall not 17 include nursing homes or other facilities maintained primarily for 18 the care of elderly and disabled persons;

19 17. "Individualized treatment plan" means a proposal developed 20 during the stay of an individual in a facility, under the provisions 21 of this title, which is specifically tailored to the treatment needs 22 of the individual. Each plan shall clearly include the following: 23 a. a statement of treatment goals or objectives, based 24 upon and related to a clinical evaluation, which can

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be reasonably achieved within a designated time interval,

- b. treatment methods and procedures to be used to obtain these goals, which methods and procedures are related to each of these goals and which include specific prognosis for achieving each of these goals,
- c. identification of the types of professional personnel
 who will carry out the treatment procedures including
 appropriate medical or other professional involvement
 by a physician or other health professional properly
 qualified to fulfill legal requirements mandated under
 state and federal law,
- 13d.documentation of involvement by the individual14receiving treatment and, if applicable, the accordance15of the individual with the treatment plan, and
- e. a statement attesting that the executive director of
 the facility or clinical director has made a
 reasonable effort to meet the plan's individualized
 treatment goals in the least restrictive environment
 possible closest to the home community of the
 individual;

18. "Telemedicine" means technology-enabled health and care management and delivery systems that extend capacity and access, which includes:

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- 1a.synchronous mechanisms, which may include live2audiovisual interaction between a patient and a health3care professional or real-time provider to provider4consultation through live interactive audiovisual5means,
- asynchronous mechanisms, which include store and 6 b. forward transfers, online exchange of health 7 information between a patient and a health care 8 9 professional and online exchange of health information 10 between health care professionals, but shall not 11 include the use of automated text messages or 12 automated mobile applications that serve as the sole 13 interaction between a patient and a health care 14 professional,

15 c. remote patient monitoring, and

d. other electronic means that support clinical health
care, professional consultation, patient and
professional health-related education, public health
and health administration;

20 19. "Recovery and recovery support" means nonclinical services 21 that assist individuals and families to recover from alcohol or drug 22 problems. They include social support, linkage to and coordination 23 among allied service providers including but not limited to 24 transportation to and from treatment or employment, employment

2	coordination,	life skills education, relapse prevention, housing
3	assistance, ch	nild care, and substance abuse education;
4	20. "Assi	isted outpatient" means a person who:
5	a.	is either currently under the care of a facility
6		certified by the Department of Mental Health and
7		Substance Abuse Services as a Community Mental Health
8		Center, or is being discharged from the custody of the
9		Oklahoma Department of Corrections, or is being
10		discharged from a residential placement by the Office
11		of Juvenile Affairs,
12	b.	is suffering from a mental illness,
13	с.	is unlikely to survive safely in the community without
14		supervision, based on a clinical determination,
15	d.	has a history of lack of compliance with treatment for
16		mental illness that has:
17		(1) prior to the filing of a petition, at least twice
18		within the last thirty-six (36) months been a
19		significant factor in necessitating
20		hospitalization or treatment in a hospital or
21		residential facility including admission to a
22		community-based structured crisis center as
23		certified by the Oklahoma Department of Mental
24		Health and Substance Abuse Services, or receipt

1 of services in a forensic or other mental health 2 unit of a correctional facility, or a specialized 3 treatment plan for treatment of mental illness in 4 a secure juvenile facility or placement in a 5 specialized residential program for juveniles, or (2) prior to the filing of the petition, resulted in 6 7 one or more acts of serious violent behavior toward self or others or threats of, or attempts 8 9 at, serious physical harm to self or others 10 within the last twenty-four (24) months, 11 e. is, as a result of his or her mental illness, unlikely 12 to voluntarily participate in outpatient treatment 13 that would enable him or her to live safely in the 14 community, 15 f. in view of his or her treatment history and current 16 behavior, is in need of assisted outpatient treatment 17 in order to prevent a relapse or deterioration which 18 would be likely to result in serious harm to the 19 person or persons as defined in this section, and 20 is likely to benefit from assisted outpatient q. 21 treatment; and 22 "Assisted outpatient treatment" means outpatient services 21. 23
