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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 713, is							
17	amended to read as follows:							
18	Section 713. A. All gross proceeds shall be the property of							
19	the Oklahoma Lottery Commission. From its gross proceeds, the							
20	Commission shall pay the operating expenses of the Commission. At							
21	least forty-five percent (45%) of gross proceeds shall be made							
22	available as prize money. However, the provisions of this							
23	subsection shall be deemed not to create any lien, entitlement,							
24	cause of action, or other private right, and any rights of holders							

of tickets or shares shall be determined by the Commission in
 setting the terms of its lottery or lotteries.

B. The Oklahoma Lottery Commission shall submit a written
report of its findings and any recommendations regarding the impact
of removing the requirement that net proceeds shall equal at least
thirty-five percent (35%) of the gross proceeds. The report shall
be submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State
Senate not later than October 1, 2020, and annually thereafter.

10 С. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund to be 11 designated the "Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund". Except as 12 otherwise provided in subsections I and J of this section, on or 13 before the fifteenth day of each calendar quarter, the Commission 14 shall transfer to the State Treasurer, for credit to the Oklahoma 15 Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount of all net proceeds 16 accruing during the preceding calendar quarter. Expenditures from 17 the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer 18 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 19 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and 20 payment.

D. Upon their deposit into the State Treasury, any monies representing a deposit of net proceeds shall then become the unencumbered property of this state, and neither the Commission nor the board of trustees shall have the power to agree or undertake

otherwise. The monies shall be invested by the State Treasurer in
 accordance with state investment practices. All earnings
 attributable to such investments shall likewise be the unencumbered
 property of the state and shall accrue to the credit of the fund
 provided for in subsection C of this section.

6 E. Monies in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund shall7 only be appropriated as follows:

1. Forty-five percent (45%) for the following:

9 a. kindergarten through twelfth grade public education,
10 including but not limited to compensation and benefits
11 for public school teachers and support employees, and
12 b. early childhood development programs, which shall
13 include but not be limited to costs associated with
14 prekindergarten and full-day kindergarten programs;

2. Forty-five percent (45%) for the following:

16 tuition grants, loans and scholarships to citizens of a. 17 this state to enable such citizens to attend colleges 18 and universities located within this state, regardless 19 of whether such colleges and universities are owned or 20 operated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 21 Education, or to attend institutions operated under 22 the authority of the Oklahoma Department of Career and 23 Technology Education; provided such tuition grants, 24 loans and scholarships shall not be made to a citizen

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- 1of this state to attend a college or university which2is not accredited by the Oklahoma State Regents for3Higher Education,
- b. construction of educational facilities for elementary
  school districts, independent school districts, The
  Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, and career
  and technology education,
- 8 c. capital outlay projects for elementary school 9 districts, independent school districts, The Oklahoma 10 State System of Higher Education, and career and 11 technology education,
- 12 d. technology for public elementary school district, 13 independent school district, state higher education, 14 and career and technology education facilities, which 15 shall include but not be limited to costs of providing 16 to teachers at accredited public institutions who 17 teach levels kindergarten through twelfth grade, 18 personnel at technology centers under the authority of 19 the Oklahoma State Department of Career and Technology 20 Education, and professors and instructors within The 21 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, the 22 necessary training in the use and application of 23 computers and advanced electronic instructional 24 technology to implement interactive learning

environments in the classroom and to access the statewide distance learning network and costs associated with repairing and maintaining advanced electronic instructional technology,

- e. endowed chairs for professors at institutions of
  higher education operated by The Oklahoma State System
  of Higher Education, and
  - f. programs and personnel of the Oklahoma School for the Deaf and the Oklahoma School for the Blind;

3. Five percent (5%) to the School Consolidation and Assistance 10 When the total amount in the School Consolidation and 11 Fund. 12 Assistance Fund from all sources equals Five Million Dollars 13 (\$5,000,000.00), all monies appropriated pursuant to this paragraph 14 which would otherwise be deposited in the School Consolidation and 15 Assistance Fund in excess of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) 16 shall be allocated by the State Department of Education to public 17 schools based on the audited end-of-year average daily membership in 18 grades 8 through 12 during the preceding school year for the purpose 19 of purchasing technology equipment. If at any time the total amount 20 in the School Consolidation and Assistance Fund drops below Five 21 Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), the monies appropriated pursuant to 22 this paragraph shall be deposited in the School Consolidation and 23 Assistance Fund until the Fund again reaches Five Million Dollars 24 (\$5,000,000.00); and

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4. Five percent (5%) to the Teachers' Retirement System
 Dedicated Revenue Revolving Fund.

In no instance shall the annual maximum percentage for administrative costs, not including marketing and advertising costs, funds set aside for prizes, commissions paid to retailers, contract fees paid to gaming system vendors and instant ticket providers or emergency-related capital expenses, exceed three percent (3%) of sales.

9 F. The portion of lottery annual net proceeds deposited to the 10 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund that exceeds Sixty Million 11 Dollars (\$60,000,000.00) shall be deposited into a Teacher 12 Empowerment Fund and appropriated by the Legislature on a cash basis 13 to be allocated by the State Department of Education to serve as a 14 state match to local public school dollars allocated for advanced, 15 lead, and master teaching certificates as outlined in Section 6-190 16 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes starting in the 2022-23 school 17 year. The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal 18 year limitations, and initial funding for the 2022-23 program will 19 start with an initial cash appropriation of Twenty Million Dollars 20 (\$20,000,000.00) funded through the additional profit contributed by 21 the Lottery that exceeds the fiscal year 2021 appropriation. Annual 22 funding for 2023 and beyond will be based on dollars contributed 23 above the base appropriation of Sixty Million Dollars 24 (\$60,000,000.00). If all of the funds are not expended annually out

1 of the Teacher Empowerment Fund, the funds will roll over for use in 2 the next fiscal year and accrue annually for use as outlined in 3 Section 6-190 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

<u>G.</u> The Legislature shall appropriate funds from the Oklahoma
Education Lottery Trust Fund only for the purposes specified in
subsection E of this section. Even when funds from the trust fund
are used for these purposes, the Legislature shall not use funds
from the trust fund to supplant or replace other state funds
supporting common education, higher education, or career and
technology education.

11 G. H. In order to ensure that the funds from the trust fund are 12 used to enhance and not supplant funding for education, the State 13 Board of Equalization shall examine and investigate appropriations 14 from the trust fund each year. At the meeting of the State Board of 15 Equalization held within five (5) days after the monthly 16 apportionment in February of each year, the State Board of 17 Equalization shall issue a finding and report which shall state 18 whether appropriations from the trust fund were used to enhance or 19 supplant education funding. If the State Board of Equalization 20 finds that education funding was supplanted by funds from the trust 21 fund, the Board shall specify the amount by which education funding 22 was supplanted. In this event, the Legislature shall not make any 23 appropriations for the ensuing fiscal year until an appropriation in 24 that amount is made to replenish the trust fund.

1 H. I. Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, no 2 deficiency in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund shall be replenished by reducing any nonlottery funds, including specifically 3 4 but without limitation, the General Revenue Fund, the Constitutional 5 Reserve Fund or the Education Reform Revolving Fund of the State Department of Education. No program or project started specifically 6 7 from lottery proceeds shall be continued from the General Revenue Fund, the Constitutional Reserve Fund or the Education Reform 8 9 Revolving Fund of the State Department of Education. Such programs 10 must be adjusted or discontinued according to available lottery 11 proceeds unless the Legislature by general law establishes 12 eligibility requirements and appropriates specific funds therefor. 13 No surplus in the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund shall be 14 reduced or transferred to correct any nonlottery deficiencies in 15 sums available for general appropriations. The provisions of this 16 subsection shall not apply to bonds or other obligations issued 17 pursuant to or to the repayment of bonds or other obligations issued 18 pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Education Promise of Excellence Act 19 of 2005.

I. J. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund to be designated the "Oklahoma Education Lottery Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Commission. The Commission shall make payments of net proceeds from

1 the fund to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund on or before 2 the fifteenth day of each calendar quarter as provided in subsection C of this section. All monies accruing to the credit of the 3 4 Oklahoma Education Lottery Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated 5 and may be budgeted and expended for the payment of net proceeds, prizes, commissions to retailers, administrative expenses and all 6 7 other expenses arising out of the operation of the education lottery, subject to the limitations provided in the Oklahoma 8 9 Education Lottery Act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made 10 upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 11 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 12 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

The monies in the fund shall be invested by the State Treasurer in accordance with state investment practices. All earnings attributable to such investments shall likewise accrue to the credit of the fund.

17 J. K. When appropriations from the Oklahoma Education Lottery 18 Trust Fund are made to common education pursuant to the provisions 19 of paragraph 1 of subsection E of this section, the appropriations 20 shall be made available on a monthly basis. In addition to the 21 provisions of subsections C and D of this section, the following 22 process shall be used to ensure that the appropriations are made 23 available to common education in a timely manner:

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1 1. Beginning in July of the fiscal year in which appropriations 2 are made to common education from the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the Commission, on or before the ninth day of each 3 4 month, shall transfer to the State Treasurer, for credit to the 5 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount of net proceeds accruing during the preceding month equal to the amount of total 6 7 monthly collections due to common education as required by paragraph 1 of subsection E of this section; 8

9 2. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
10 Services shall allocate the transfers provided for in paragraph 1 of
11 this subsection to the State Department of Education on a monthly
12 basis, not to exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual apportionment
13 for the fiscal year; and

3. The total amount of transfers to the Oklahoma Education
Lottery Trust Fund of net lottery proceeds made pursuant to this
subsection shall not exceed the total appropriations made to common
education from the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund for the
specific fiscal year.

19 K. L. When appropriations from the Oklahoma Education Lottery
20 Trust Fund are made to The Oklahoma State System of Higher
21 Education, the appropriations shall be made available to the System
22 on a monthly basis. In addition to the provisions of subsections C
23 and D of this section, the following process shall be used to ensure

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that the appropriations are made available to The Oklahoma State
 System of Higher Education in a timely manner:

Beginning in July of the fiscal year in which appropriations 3 1. 4 are made to The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education from the 5 Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the Commission, on or before the ninth day of each month, shall transfer to the State Treasurer, 6 7 for credit to the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the amount of net proceeds accruing during the preceding month equal to the 8 9 amount of total monthly collections due to the Oklahoma State 10 Regents for Higher Education as required by paragraph 2 of 11 subsection E of this section;

12 2. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 13 Services shall allocate the transfers provided for in paragraph 1 of 14 this subsection to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 15 on a monthly basis, not to exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual 16 apportionment for the fiscal year; and

The total amount of transfers to the Oklahoma Education
 Lottery Trust Fund of net lottery proceeds made pursuant to this
 subsection shall not exceed the total appropriations made to The
 Oklahoma State System for Higher Education from the Oklahoma
 Education Lottery Trust Fund for the specific fiscal year.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
 SECTION 3. The provisions of this act shall be contingent upon
 the enactment of the provisions of House Bill No. of the 2nd
