11	WHEREAS, it is widely acknowledged that the oil boom in Oklahoma

13	the town we now call Glenpool. From these early beginnings, our
14	state gave birth to some of the biggest oil companies in the nation.
15	The Oklahoma State Capitol Building is the only capitol in the world
16	with an oil well under it; and
17	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma oil and gas industry accounts for more
18	than 322,000 Oklahoma jobs and nearly One Billion Dollars
19	(\$1,000,000,000.00) collected in gross production tax; and
20	WHEREAS, these funds help build roads, bridges, and schools as
21	well as fuel economic and capital development in Oklahoma. In 2020,
22	Oklahoma was a top five oil and gas producing state and its
23	production is an economic engine of the State of Oklahoma; and

1 WHEREAS, the United States should restore the production of oil 2 and gas to the level that existed prior to January of 2021; and WHEREAS, the United States federal government should lift all 3 4 new regulations that deny the United States the capacity to produce 5 its own energy, which previously amounted to 13 million barrels of 6 oil a day, which would relieve economic hardship and turmoil across 7 the United States; and WHEREAS, the United States federal government should immediately 8
