**Research Analysis**

HB 1061 directs funds in the Canceled Warrant Fund due to the cancellation of warrants from the Crime Victims Compensation Fund to the Crime Victims Compensation Fund, rather than the General Revenue Fund.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1061 in its current form directs funds to the Crime Victims Compensation Fund that would otherwise be deposited to the credit of the General Revenue Fund; for this reason the measure will have a negative revenue impact on the General Revenue Fund. Based on historical estimates provided by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES), the average amount of funds expected to be redirected would be approximately \$5,500 annually.
