**Research Analysis**

HB 1085, as introduced, modifies the guardian appointment process to waive the requirement for a child abuse and neglect information system (CANIS) check in the case of an emergency placement if it cannot be attained in a reasonable amount of time and the court decides waiving the requirement is in the minor's best interest.

**Fiscal Analysis**
