**Research Analysis**

HB1142, as introduced, creates the “Oklahoma Industrial Hemp Remediation Program”. The measure establishes the amount of THC a hemp plant can have in order to be deemed compliant.

The measure allows a hemp grower that has produced noncompliant hemp to request approval from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture to remediate the hemp. Any remediated hemp shall be extracted into a concentrate and sampled for compliance.

If it is compliant, it can be used in commercial sales. If the remediated hemp is still not compliant, it shall be destroyed.
