Fiscal Analysis

HB 1620 protects Agritourism as defined in the bill the use of “livestock or other animals for entertainment or educational purpose.” It does not create a burden on local governments or state agencies, but prevents them from placing one on those who use animals in various activities. Therefore, it seems unlikely to create a fiscal burden on any of these entities or agencies.

The insertion of the paragraph stating agritourism is an engrained historical fact does not add any additional requirements that would create a fiscal impact, and neither does the use of the word “farm” instead of “zoo.” Given this, it does not appear HB 1620 will create a fiscal impact on the State’s budget or appropriations.
