**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1620 protects Agritourism as defined in the bill the use of “livestock or other animals for entertainment or educational purpose.” It does not create a burden on local governments or state agencies, but prevents them from placing one on those who use animals in various activities. Therefore, it seems unlikely to create a fiscal burden on any of these entities or agencies.

The addition of “pursuant to the Oklahoma Horse Racing Act,” does not add any additional requirements that would create a fiscal impact. Given this, it does not appear HB 1620 will create a fiscal impact on the State’s budget or appropriations.
