Research Analysis

There are multiple Senate amendments to HB1620.

Amendments 1 and 2 remove references to “other animals” and replace the phrase with the word “poultry”.

Amendment 3 clarifies that “agritourism activities” does not include cockfighting or dog fighting.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1620 protects Agritourism as defined in the bill the use of “livestock or other animals for entertainment or educational purpose.” It does not create a burden on local governments or state agencies, but prevents them from placing one on those who use animals in various activities. Therefore, it seems unlikely to create a fiscal burden on any of these entities or agencies.

The addition of “pursuant to the Oklahoma Horse Racing Act,” does not add any additional requirements that would create a fiscal impact. Given this, it does not appear HB 1620 will create a fiscal impact on the State’s budget or appropriations.

The Senate amendments do not affect the fiscal impact on this measure.
