**Research Analysis**

The Senate Amendments to HB 1776 modifies the sentencing powers of the court by requiring all persons convicted of a misdemeanor or felony for the possession of a controlled dangerous substance to submit provide a DNA sample for CODIS. The measure also provides that an attorney employed by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation may enter an appearance in court if requested to do so by another prosecuting authority.

The Senate amendments to the measure insert sections that restore the ability of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to collect and analyze DNA samples from individuals convicted of possession of any controlled dangerous substance.
