Research Analysis

HB 1783, as introduced, gives the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission jurisdiction over amateur kickboxers and amateur kickboxing events. This measure also eliminates the exemption from the provisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act for amateur combative sports events conducted or sponsored by amateur sanctioning bodies. USA Boxing events and events sponsored or conducted by the International Olympic Committee are exempted from the provisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act.

Fiscal Analysis

Officials with the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission indicate the measure will “possibly have a very small fiscal impact on the Athletic Commission”. Revenue generated from combative sporting events licensed and regulated by the Commission is derived by the number of events promoted, the number of athletes participating and attendance at events.

Based on historical data, two to three amateur kickboxing events may be promoted in any year. Revenue from three events would include promoter licenses (\$250), event permits (\$150), participant licenses (\$2,160), coaches licenses (\$3,600) and attendance related revenue (\$1,350) – a total of \$7,510.

Costs to the Commission would include those for lead inspectors (\$1,513.20) and five (5) inspectors (\$3,033) – a total of \$4,546.20.
