Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 2126 creates a grocery and convenience store spirits license. Licensees can purchase wine or spirits from a wine and spirits wholesaler and beer from a beer distributor or a small brewer self-distribution licensee, and sell such beverages for off-premises consumption only. Licensees may also sell spirits, wine and beer to charitable alcoholic beverage auction or event licensees. The measure sets a fee schedule for licenses and annual surcharges.

Fiscal Analysis

The committee substitute to HB 2126 creates a grocery and convenience store spirits license. The measure provides for the scope of the license and the fees for the license.

Upon review and with consultation from the Alcoholic Beverage Law Enforcement Commission, the measure is determined to have a potential positive revenue impact to the state depending on the number of licenses issued.
