**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2308 allows the Department of Public Safety to require motor license agents to purchase cameras from the Department for the motor license agent's use in conducting business. A motor license agent who purchases a camera from the Department is responsible for obtaining Internet services that operate at adequate speeds to allow the agents to effectively transact business and transmit data to and from the agency.

The measure repeals Title 47, Section 1140.1:

**Fiscal Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB 2308 creates new law providing that the Department of Public Safety may require motor license agents to purchase cameras from the Department for use by the motor license agent. The measure further provides that if a motor license agent purchases a camera from the Department the motor license agent shall be responsible for obtaining adequate Internet services at their own expense.

The measure also repeals a section of law that requires the Department to furnish cameras without charge under certain conditions.

The impact of the measure is currently under review with the Department.
