**Research Analysis**

HB 2312, as introduced, modifies the competency evaluation process to include youthful offenders in addition to delinquency. The measure also adds language that a copy of the child's petition or information is presented to the court. At any time prior to or during delinquency or youthful offender proceedings, the Office of Juvenile Affairs may raise the issue of a child's competency to participate in the proceeding for any child in its custody.
