**Research Analysis**

HB 2326 provides that a member of the Oklahoma Abstractors Board that has served two consecutive terms may be reappointed after the expiration of at least one full term. The measure provides that a felony conviction that could result in the loss of an abstract license must substantially relate to the practice of abstracting and pose a reasonable threat to public safety. The measure defines “poses a reasonable threat” to mean the nature of criminal conduct for which the person was convicted involved an act or threat of harm against another and has a bearing on the fitness or ability to serve the public or work with others in the occupation. The measure defines “substantially relates” to mean the nature of criminal conduct for which the person was convicted has a direct bearing on the fitness or ability to perform one or more of the duties or responsibilities necessarily related to the occupation.

The Senate amendment addresses a scrivener’s error.
