**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 2660 splits the medical marijuana processor license into two categories: nonvolatile, which involves using any solvent in the extraction process that is not volatile, and volatile, which involves using any solvent that is or produces a flammable gas or vapor that will create explosive or ignitable mixtures when present in the air in sufficient quantities.

The measure also increases, from 10 pounds to 25 pounds, the amount of usable marijuana a grower shall separate into harvest batches. The measure decreases, from 10 pounds to 4 liters, the amount of distillate a processor shall separate into production batches. The measure directs OMMA to promulgate rules regarding final products, which are defined in the measure to include but not be limited to cookies, brownies, candies, gummies and chocolates, and prohibits OMMA from requiring testing of such products more often than every 200 grams of THC, unless the batch size processed is less than 200 grams of THC.
