Research Analysis

HB 2676 allows controlled dangerous substances issued by a practitioner who prescribes the substance that would be consumed within 72 hours or who determines an electronic prescription cannot be issued in a timely manner for a patient at risk to be dispensed with an electronic prescription. The measure also allows electronic prescriptions to be utilized for compounded prescriptions, compounded infusion prescriptions, and prescriptions issued under approved research protocols.

Additionally, the measure requires practitioners who issue electronic prescriptions or their employers to purchase official prescription forms from a list of vendors approved by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure modifies the requirements regarding paper prescriptions of controlled dangerous substances.

Upon review and with consultation from the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the measure is determined to have a positive fiscal impact to the state. The measure would save the Bureau approximately \$400,000 in costs that the Bureau is currently required to bear.
