**Research Analysis**

The third amendment to the floor substitute for HB 2701 amends the definition of *educational scholarships* to include scholarships to a student with either or both parents in jail or prison of \$5,000 or 90 percent of the statewide annual average per-pupil expenditure, whichever is greater, to cover all or part of the tuition, fees and transportation costs of a qualified school.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure adds certain scholarship to a student where either or both parents are incarcerated in a jail or prison to the definition of “Educational scholarships”. No change in the investment or revenue features of the bill is anticipated.
