**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB2727 allows Adulting 101 to be taught as an elective class in public schools.

Instruction may include information about cooking, automobile maintenance, applying and interviewing for jobs, basic financial skills, career pathways, and stress management.

Adulting 101 may be taught to students in grades 6-12. School districts may determine at what grade level each area of instruction will be taught to students. Districts are also authorized to partner with the CareerTech system, nonprofits, or private organizations with relevant expertise, to assist in teaching Adulting 101.
