**Research Analysis**

HB2727, as introduced, requires basic life skills to be taught in public schools, subject to the availability of funding.

Life skills instruction must include information about nutrition and cooking, applying and interviewing for jobs, and self-discipline and time management among other things.

The measure requires the State Board of Education to adopt curriculum standards for basic life skills, and requires students to fulfill the requirements for a basic life skills education in order to graduate.

School districts may determine at what grade level each area of life skill instruction will be taught to students.
