## **Research Analysis**

HB2751, as introduced, requires public high schools to offer at least one computer science course beginning with the 2024-2025 school year. Middle schools must offer instruction in exploratory computer science, and elementary schools must offer instruction in computer science basics. The courses must meet or exceed state standards.

By June 30<sup>th</sup> of each year, school districts must submit a report to the State Board of Education which includes:

- Courses taught in each school, with course descriptions
- The number and percentage of students who enrolled in the courses, disaggregated by gender, race, English language learner, grade level, and eligibility for free and reduced price lunch.
- The number of computer science instructors at each school

Lastly, the measure requires candidates in the teacher preparation system to receive instruction in computer science and computational thinking as it applies to student learning.
