HB 2808 defines the following terms: Department; Emergency care; Commissioner; Facility; Maximum emergency stay period; and Short-term emergency and nonemergency facility; The measure requires a license to establish or operate a short-term emergency and nonemergency medical facility in the state. The measure also prohibits facilities and people from classifying themselves to the public as providers of emergency care unless licensed to do so.
