Research Analysis

HB 3009 creates the Voice Recognition Privacy Act of 2022 and places it in a new title in the Oklahoma Statutes, Title 75A Technology. The measure requires that a device that features voice recognition technology be prominently labeled with what actions or commands activate that feature. The measure also prohibits voice recognition devices from using recordings for any advertising purpose, sharing or selling to a third party, or retaining recordings without user opt-in. The manufacturer may share information with a third party without consent only in the case of completing a function or service.

If a device or service offers the ability to retain voice recordings that are not deidentified, there must be a way to review and delete the recordings. Recordings that are used to improve the accuracy of the voice recognition service require consent from the user.

The measure prohibits the manufacturer from being compelled to build specific features into devices that would facilitate law enforcement's ability to monitor private activity.

Lastly, the measure creates opportunities for court actions and civil penalties.
