**Fiscal Analysis**

The Senate amendments to the measure would only restore the title to the measure.

Upon review, the Senate amendments do not alter the fiscal impact of the measure as passed by the House. The measure would eliminate an administrative fine assessed by the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement (ABLE) Commission for underage tobacco possession and use. In FY-2021, the Commission collected approximately \$14,375 in such tobacco fines. These fines are deposited into the Alcoholic Beverage Control Fund, which is an authorized fund subject to legislative appropriation.
