## **Research Analysis**

HB 3320 the subcommittee recommendation, creates a state employee information and promotion program through the Tourism and Recreation Department and gives the department the authority to promulgate rules for the program. The measure also stipulates procedures for the program.

Program procedures include:

- Full-time state employees, excluding State Legislators, to stay at any state-operated lodge or cabin at a discounted rate for two consecutive nights per year;
- State employees coordinate with facility managers for availability and approval; and
- State employees are responsible for all other expenses and to complete a questionnaire provided at the end of their stay.
