Research Analysis

The subcommittee recommendation to HB 3421 provides that from July 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023, each motor license agent accepting driver license applications for 100% disabled veterans or from individuals sixty-five years of age or older is to receive \$6 of a 4-year license and \$8 for an 8-year driver license to be deducted from the daily motor license agent receipts. The provisions of this bill are contingent upon the enactment of HB 3419 or SB 1605 (Service Oklahoma).

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3421 provides that from July 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023, each motor license agent accepting driver license applications for 100% disabled veterans or from individuals sixty-five years of age or older is to receive \$6 of a 4-year license and \$8 for an 8-year driver license to be deducted from the daily motor license agent receipts. The provisions of this bill are contingent upon the enactment of HB 3419 (Service Oklahoma)

Data from Calendar Year 2021 indicate that approximately 147,259 4-year licenses were issued to qualifying individuals and approximately 55,458 8-year licenses were issued.

Based on the provisions of the bill, the potential impact to state revenues would be \$883,554 for 4-year licenses and \$665,496 for 8-year licenses, for a total of \$1,549,050. These figures are an estimate.
