**Research Analysis**

HB 3475 modifies the Oklahoma Open Records Act by providing that a request for records may be denied if the request places an excessive disruption in producing public records on the public body or if the custodian has reason to believe that repeated requests are intended to disrupt other essential functions of the public body. The measure provides that if a public trust hospital enters into a joint venture or acquires an interest in a not-for-profit entity to effectuate the administration of the mission of the public trust, that entity is not subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.
