HB 3671 provides for a 3 percent annualized salary increase to be awarded to certain full-time officers and employees of the state whose gross annual salary is \$80,000 or less. The measure also establishes the ineligibility of certain state employees such as elected officials, agency directors and others whose salary or employment is governed by statute.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure provides an increase in salary of three percent (3.0%) for all full-time officer s and employees of the state whose gross annual salary as of June 30, 2022 was \$80,000 or less.

Utilizing human resource data provided by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) and calculations from prior employee compensation initiatives an estimate is made with certain of the available data:
