**Research Analysis**

HB 3743 prohibits any person convicted of a misdemeanor or felony domestic violence offense from using, purchasing or possessing a firearm. The person is prohibited from being in a vehicle with a firearm or reside in a location which contains a firearm.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, as introduced, would prohibit any person convicted of a misdemeanor or felony domestic violence offense from using, purchasing, or possessing a firearm. The person would be prohibited from being in a vehicle with a firearm or reside in a location which contains a firearm.

Upon review, passage of the measure may increase fine revenue. By increasing the instances where a person is committing an unlawful act, there may be an increase in persons found guilty and fined.
