Research Analysis

Committee Amendment 1 to HB3810 expands on the conditions required to be convicted of a misdemeanor crime for knowingly publishing a judge's personal information. To be convicted, the person committing the act must have done so with intent to threaten, intimidate or harass.

Fiscal Analysis

The first full committee amendment to the measure clarifies that the misdemeanor created by the measure would only apply to cases where personal information was published with the intent to threaten, intimidate, or harass.

Upon review, adoption of the amendment would narrow the scope of unlawful activity defined by the measure. Adoption of the amendment would reduce the potential fee revenue insofar as the amendment would decrease the potential pool of cases filed.
