Research Analysis

The second floor substitute for HB3835 creates the Facilitating Internet Broadband Rural Expansion (FIBRE) Act. The measure:

- Prohibits cross subsidization between rural electric co-ops' retail electricity services and retail broadband services;
- Prohibits co-ops from charging costs related to electric services to retail broadband customers, and vice versa;
- Requires co-ops to ensure that rates and fees charged for attachments to utility poles are nondiscriminatory;
- Requires co-ops and communications service providers to engage in good-faith
 negotiations to determine a fair pole attachment rate, and provides a formula for
 determining rates if the parties cannot agree.
