Research Analysis

HB 3897 provides a premium discount, not to exceed 5 percent, for workers' compensation insurance if the insured has been certified as a work-based learning employer providing a *work-based learning placement*, which is defined in the measure as an arrangement between an industry partner and a local school system for students to receive structured learning at a job site. The Insurance Commissioner and the State Board of Technology Education are directed to conduct a study to determine if the premium discount encourages employers to provide work-based learning opportunities.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure, as introduced, provides that insurers offering workers' compensation insurance policies may grant a 5% reduction in policy premiums if a policy holder is certified by the State Board of Career and Technology Education to the Administrative Workers' Compensation Commission as a work-based learning employer. The measure includes a claw-back provision for the premium credit if the employer misrepresents its status as a work-based learning employer.

The measure is under review with relevant agencies. Fiscal impact information will be completed.
