Research Analysis

HB 3899 extends the consideration of a mental injury or illness to be a compensable injury if it was sustained by an emergency services employee related to duties performed while responding to an emergency.

Fiscal Analysis

The measure, as introduced, would allow a mental injury without a corresponding physical injury to be a compensable workers' compensation claim for police officers, firefighters, emergency medical technicians, or any other first responders. The mental injury or illness would have to be suffered in the course of duties performed in responding to the emergency.

Upon review and with consultation from the Workers' Compensation Commission and the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, the measure is determined to have an unknown fiscal impact to the state.

The impact to the state results from the application of the provisions of the measure to those claimants that are state employees. The exact impact to the state would depend on the number and disposition of claims. Since these types of claims are not currently compensable, it is unknown what impact the measure would have.
