Research Analysis

HB 4100 creates the Operation Work Zone Awareness program and provides a framework for the program. The Operation Work Zone Awareness program is designed to educate the public on the dangers of committing moving violations when traveling in a highway construction work zone by developing an online work zone awareness presentation and publishing it on the Department of Public Safety website. The measure also provides that certain motorist that have received a moving violation citation, who complete the program and provide the certificate of completion in court, are entitled to a dismissal of the fine.

The measure establishes certain guidelines such as:

- Establishing that participation in the Operation Work Zone Awareness program is voluntary and allows offenders to participate in the program only once;
- Prohibiting holders of commercial driver licenses cited while driving a commercial vehicle and motorists who commit impaired driving offenses from participating in the program;
- Establishing a fee of \$75 to be paid by the motorist for participating in the program; and
- Establishing that \$15 of the fees collected be deposited into the Department of Public Safety Patrol Vehicle Revolving Fund, \$35 be deposited into the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund and \$25 be deposited into the Court Information System Revolving Fund.

The Senate amendments raised the fee for participating in the program from \$40 to \$75 and modified how that money is apportioned.
