HB4118, as introduced, provides an 8 percent salary increase for court reporters effective July 1, 2022.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, as introduced, would provide an 8% increase in the salary of court reporters regularly employed by district courts, the Workers' Compensation Court of Existing Claims, and the Corporation Commission. The raise would be effective July 1st, 2022.

The table below shows the impact to each agency.

After consultation with the agencies, the costs for the District Courts and the Corporation Commission would require additional appropriations to absorb. The cost for the Court of Existing Claims would be absorbable within existing budgetary resources.
