Research Analysis

The subcommittee recommendation to HB 4118 provides that beginning in fiscal year 2023, each court reporter is to receive an annual salary of \$53,000. The measure also provides that beginning in fiscal year 2023, each secretary-bailiff is to receive an annual salary of \$42,000.

Fiscal Analysis

The subcommittee recommendation would provide a salary of \$53,000 to court reporters regularly employed by district courts, the Workers' Compensation Court of Existing Claims, and the Corporation Commission. The new salary would be effective July 1st, 2022.

The table below shows the impact to each agency.

After consultation with the agencies, the costs for the District Courts and the Corporation Commission would require additional appropriations to absorb. The cost for the Court of Existing Claims would be absorbable within existing budgetary resources.

The subcommittee recommendation would also provide a salary of \$42,000 for secretary bailiffs. After consultation with the Administrative Office of the Courts, this provision would have a total impact of \$2,382,996, which includes a salary cost of \$1,915,900 and a mandatory benefits cost of \$467,096. This is based on 196 budgeted secretary bailiff positions.

The total impact of the measure would thus be \$5,863,371.
