**Research Analysis**

HB 4191 clarifies that no person is to loiter upon property containing a critical infrastructure without permission. The measure adds "county-owned property" and "publicly owned property whose purpose is to provide for the health and wellness of the community" to the list of critical infrastructure facilities.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, as introduced, would make it unlawful to loiter upon property containing a critical infrastructure facility without the permission of the owner or lawful occupant. The measure would also add any publicly owned property that provides for the health and wellness of the community or county-owned property to the definition of critical infrastructure facility.

Upon review, the measure may have a fiscal impact. The measure would expand the scope of unlawful activity. By doing so, the measure may increase fine revenue to the state. It may also increase the costs of incarceration borne by the Department of Corrections. It is unknown what the exact impact passage of the measure would have.
