Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to HB 4224 provides that it is an affirmative defense to prosecution of a youthful offender, or delinquent offense that the alleged youthful offender or delinquent was a victim of human trafficking. The measure provides that a minor who has committed prostitution offenses or other nonviolent felony offenses as a result of being a victim of human trafficking shall not be subject to child-in-need-of-supervision proceedings. The measure clarifies that no child who is a victim of human trafficking shall be subject to juvenile delinquency or criminal proceedings for prostitution related offenses.
