## **Research Analysis**

HJR 1057 the proposed committee substitute, sends a constitution amendment to a vote of the people that, if approved, would increase the maximum millage rate from 3 mills to 10 mills for operational expenses of emergency medical service districts. It would also increase the maximum millage rate from 3 mills to 10 mills for the payment of interest and principal on bonds used to buy and maintain emergency vehicles and equipment.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The Tax Commission continues to analyze the provisions of the resolution. A preliminary statement [edited to reflect the Proposed Committee Substitute]:

HJR 1057 proposes amendment to Article 10, Section 9C of the Oklahoma Constitution to change from 3 mills to 10 mills[1] the constitutional limitation on the maximum number of mills that an Emergency Medical Service District ("EMS District") may vote to support the EMS District or a district board of trustees may levy to pay outstanding bonds approved for purposes of acquiring emergency vehicles, equipment and the maintenance and housing thereof.

The Proposed Committee Substitute1 for HJR 1057 proposes changing the threshold from 3 to 10 mills. Potential unknown increase in local property tax revenues is attributable to the proposed constitutional amendments
